
VOLUNTEER VIEW







GOOD FOOD BOX

Through many donations, we are able to provide clients with fresh produce for the week following the Good Food Box delivery. This program is open to all at a cost of \$30 - \$40 depending on the size ordered. Our latest order worked out to be \$1.02 per pound for a large box, \$1.17 per pound for a medium box and \$1.14 per pound for a small box so we see a considerable amount of savings through this program.

ROTARY BIKE PROGRAM



Our local Rotary club continues to provide our clients with 'like new' bikes, reconditioned by local resident, John Jenkins. John does a fantastic job – you'd never know these bikes are recycled; they come to us in pristine condition! 24 children were able to have a bike for the summer this year.
